9.1 to 9.2 – A Visual Guide to the TOGAF Documentation

In this poster we summarize the main changes between versions 9.1 and 9.2 of the TOGAF documentation. The aim is to provide a high-level visual comparison of the two versions – you can find a more detailed discussion of the changes in our blog and in the Good e-Learning training materials. Note that Chapter numbers throughout the documentation are now slightly different from those in 9.1; this slight difference can cause confusion when referring to resources based on version 9.1

A body of knowledge

All of the documentation in 9.1 and earlier versions was contained in a single and large manual or book.

9.2 is more modulate, & is separated into three parts:

- A set of Guidelines
- TOGAF Standard Version 9.2
- Tools & Techniques

In the future... TOGAF will consist of:

- The Normative Core
- Guidelines
- Tools & Techniques

Structure of the documentation

In 9.1 there were 7 parts. In 9.2 this has been reduced to 6 parts. The two reference models in Part VII of 9.1 are now two free-standing guides in the TOGAF Library

The TOGAF Library:
 (A “portfolio of guidance material”. Documents are categorised as Standard, TOGAF Series Guides, Guides, or White Papers)
 • **Foundation** Documents
 • **Generic** Guidance and Techniques
 • **Industry-Specific** Guidance and Techniques
 • **Organization-Specific** Guidance and Techniques

N.B. This structure is based on the Enterprise Continuum

The ADM (Part II)

Changes to the ADM are fairly minor – for example, the Approach section has been moved to the end of each chapter, and references to additional sources have been updated.

Note that for navigation of the document, all chapter numbers are now one less than they were in version 9.1

Business Architecture has been updated throughout the TOGAF documentation, but is most noticeable in Phase B and Phase A of the ADM.

For example, there is a more detailed description of Business Architecture activities, including the use of Value Streams and Business Capabilities. There are new artifacts such as the Value Stream and Business Capabilities catalogues, the Business Model diagram, and the Strategy/Capability Matrix.

ADM Guidelines and Techniques (Part III)

For many of these chapters there are only minor editorial updates – similar to those applied to the ADM (such as links to additional references or sources).

Some chapters have been moved... there are now 11 chapters in this part (previously there were 14)

Content Framework (part IV)

Largely minor updates, in particular changes to reflect changes to the Business Architecture, changes in terminology, and references (such as links to ISO/IEC/IEEE 42010:2011 and ISO/IEC/IEEE 15288:2015).

Enterprise Continuum and Tools (Part V)

Largely minor updates. For example, links to the TRM and III-RM are moved to the external TOGAF Series Guides and the TOGAF library. A link has been included to the IT4IT Reference Architecture.

Architecture Capability Framework (Part VI)

Minor editorial changes.

Level 5 of the maturity model has been renamed from Optimizing to Measured
